Who are we?

Friends of Hope for Africa Missions (FHAM), is a non-profit making Christian organisation, whose primary aim is to partner and support the charitable work undertaken by **Hope For Africa Missions (HFA)**.

HFA is a South African Charity, which provides spiritual (Bible based), financial and practical assistance to various communities in Northern South Africa, Mozambique, Malawi, Zimbabwe Lesotho and Swaziland. Its projects are church based and include agricultural development, education for orphans, technical training, and leadership training.

FHAM is a Company Limited by Guarantee, registered in England (No. 521659), and a registered charity (No. 1107368). Its registered office is, 143 Westwood Road, Tilehurst, Reading, Berkshire. RG31 6LH.

What is our Aim?

We aim to support **HFA** and its programme of Christian, community based and sustainable development.

In particular we shall be responsible for European activities in co-ordinating:

- ◆ the raising and donation of funds by individuals, groups and churches
- ◆ visits to **HFA**, to give help and assistance in their work,
- ◆ assistance to those who are called to serve God within **HFA**, short or longer term
- ◆ provision of pastoral and developmental (spiritual, financial and practical) support, to members of **HFA**.

We will work with **HFA**, as their partners, by following our Lord Jesus' example of sharing the gospel and providing for their physical need.

Basis of Faith

We believe that Jesus is the Christ, God's Son and by believing in Him we have life through His name. And as children of God, we would seek to serve Him, by sharing the message of His gospel; that He does not want anyone to perish, but everyone to come to Him in repentance (2 Peter 3:8):

- ◆ We believe that the Bible is God's word and desire to live by its standards and practices
- ◆ We believe that as the Lord Jesus cared for those with whom he came into contact that we should too
- ◆ We believe that as the Bible teaches that, "the prayer of the righteous man is powerful and effective" (James 5:16)
- ◆ We believe in sharing of God's love to all, "for God so loved the world, that he gave His only son.." (John 3:16)
- ◆ We believe that God has made it possible for all our needs to be supplied through the Lord Jesus Christ.

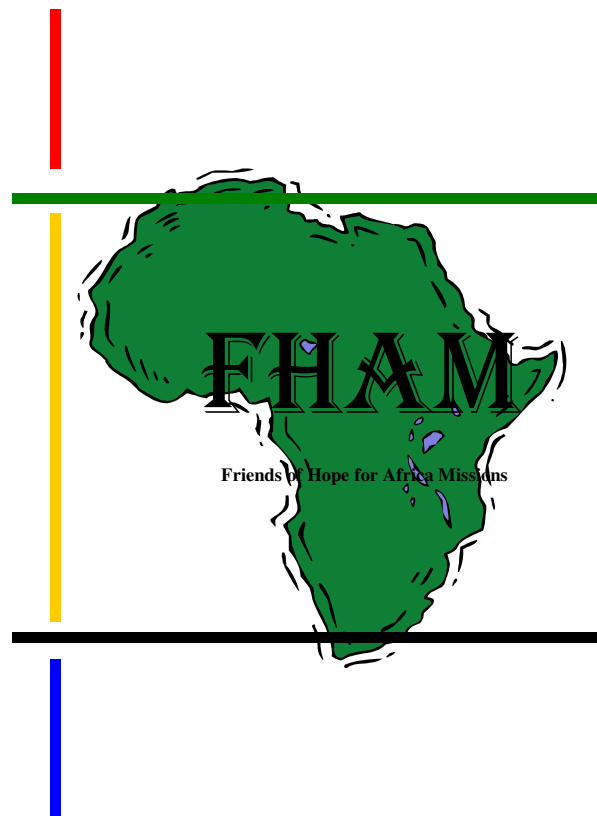

The Directors and Trustees of Friends of Hope for Africa Missions would like to take this opportunity to say thanks to all our donors for your prayer and financial support.

Brief summary of what has happened to date

Visits — As our main aim is to co-ordinate activities of **Hope For Africa Missions (HFA)** in Europe, **Hendrick Mahlangu** its director and founder, was invited to come to UK (April/May 2005) to meet with us and share the aims of HFA; which now forms part of our own aims. Other visits from members of HFA are planned in the coming year.

Mozambique outreach — **Reading3000**, which is a local charitable initiative, was set up to support various projects of HFA, in Mozambique. In 2005, a group of 15 volunteers went to assist in the building of house for a key worker and a community centre, continued with the development of a sewing project (begun in the previous year) and in the building of relationships. Various other fund-raising projects were undertaken, e.g. Sunflower Project 2005, Christmas Gifts Appeal 2005

Malawi outreach — A group of 13 youngsters led by Tom Evans from a local Reading Church, St Laurences, went out to HFA in Malawi, to assist in a building project in the summer of 2005. Support was also given in setting up of other projects.

Maintaining Links - Over the years, various links and associations formed by a number of individuals, Schools and Churches continues and the contributions given, were sent to HFA and were gratefully received.
Directors met with the CEO of **WorldShare**, a UK based charity and long term supporter of HFA and some of its projects, to clarify our roles and partnerships.

Zimbabwe Appeal - Received gifts totalling £880.00; with grateful thanks to all who contributed

Finance - In the financial year ending August 2005, a total of £24,896.33 was donated through FHAM for HFA of which 99.95% was transferred to HFA.
Our aim is to transfer 100% and or as near to 100% of all donations received.

Hope For Africa Missions (HFA) - The fact sheet enclosed gives a more detail breakdown of how the work started, its mission and vision.

Brief insight into some of our aims and objectives

To develop support groups, for HFA projects in African countries.

- ◆ The groups will function very much like Reading3000, under the auspices of FHAM.
- ◆ The projects will be agreed upon by HFA and FHAM.
- ◆ Each group will seek its support from its surrounding area and 'fund raise' accordingly.

To increase awareness of the work being done by HFA and to encourage others in supporting it by prayer and giving.

To establish support for the following mission services.

- ◆ Missionary and Pastoral Support
- ◆ Leadership Training
- ◆ Vehicle Maintenance
- ◆ Administration

5 Year Strategic Plan— pray with us that the Lord;

- ◆ will provide the *monies* required to fulfil the programme
- ◆ will provide the *donor base*, to support this work and
- ◆ will raise up the *area support groups* for supporting various projects in Malawi, Zimbabwe, Lesotho and Swaziland.

Our desire is that our brothers and sisters in the various areas of Africa, should be equipped, spiritually and physically, and provided with the means, whereby they will in time, be able to provide for themselves, their families and their communities.
